



Level 1-4 Training The Online Webinar Track

Description

The *Online Webinar Track* is a new delivery method that became available beginning February 2016. 11 participants joined the Society President by logging in with their computer to see the presentation and calling in by phone. For 10 sessions, one and one half hour each, instruction was provide for 70 minutes followed by 20 minutes of discussion and Q&A. These sessions were recorded and are now available to others.

Participants will receive approximately 500 PowerPoint slides, a further reading and resource list, and various handouts for many of the sessions.

We focus on the meaning of church health, the role of the consultant, how to assess church health, and how to facilitate church revitalization.
